

# UNIT LIFE SURVEY – strengthening our unit PROJECT EVOLVE SILVER PART B – YOUTH SURVEY

- How are the units across our state functioning?
- Does the Scout Method effectively meet their needs??
- Do our youth members enjoy their Scouting experience?

To help us understand the needs of our youth members and learn how to provide better support for success, we have developed a simple survey for all youth members to complete.

### Background - how the survey was developed

- Scouts Australia and Curtin University agreed to have university researchers develop a survey to understand the strength of "Unit Life" within the Scouts Australia Youth Program.
- The assessment was geared towards understanding the current effectiveness and implementation of unit life ideals through two avenues:
  - 1) Youth perceptions of the Scout method and
  - 2) Youth psychological outcomes due to Scout participation.
- Survey questions were developed to better understand the psychological outcomes of the Scouts, centred upon their participation in Scouting; these items were generated to assess feelings of belonging, confidence, enjoyment, identity, and impact on self/others.
- In the initial item generation phase, 93 questions were developed to be pilot-tested and validated for statistical strength and utility.
- The items were sent via a Qualtrics survey link to Youth members across the different Australian States.
- Following the testing of the initial 93 items, 17 items were found to meet acceptable thresholds on variability and non-redundancy.
- The final 17 items were categorised into the following groups:
  - Growth and Motivation: To capture Youth's learning and engagement during Scouting activities.
  - $\circ\quad$  Youth Leading: To assess Youth's empowerment during Scouting activities.
  - Team health: To capture Youth's perceptions of their unit's functioning and their sense of belonging.
  - o Scout Identity: To assess Youth's identification as a Scout and its values.
  - o Adult Leadership: To capture Youth's perceptions of their leader's effectiveness.
  - o Nature/Outdoors: To assess how Scouting helps Youth value nature and the outdoors.
  - Impact on Community: To gauge Youth's perceptions of having an impact through Scouting activities.
- Further demographic analysis from the pilot testing determined that the full 17-item survey would be administered to older youth (Scouts, Venturers, and Rovers), while 11 items were suitable for Joeys and Cubs.

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#### **DATA SECURITY**

- Individual youth members can't be identified through the survey. The survey does not collect name, address, date of birth or other personal information.
- Survey data is stored on the Scouts SA servers within Australia.
