Training Flowchart For a Trained Participant on Flatwater, Canoe or Kayak



Hold a Safe Participant Flatwater Paddling Qualification (Youth) / Endorsement (Leader)

Core

Core training is required for all Adventurous Scout Activities Training.

This may be achieved in the canoe/kayak training or through another activity training program, e.g. bushwalking

To lead Scout members in Canoe's / Kayak's you will then need to progress to a specific skill set.
The base level for supervising qualifications, for Canoe and Kayak, flatwater, is Trained Participant (TP).

The Patrol Activity **MUST** be completed within 12 months of commencement of the Trained Participant kayak / canoe training course.
