• Each Unit is responsible for its own campsite. Ensure you have enough equipment to support all youth and adults - plan smart and pack efficiently.

Menu Planning

• Units will be **self-catering** for the weekend. Keep meals simple, cost-effective, and nutritious.

Label Everything

 Please label all clothing, hats, and drink bottles. Lost items are common - labels help us return them quickly!

🥎 Medication & Health Forms

- Bring all regular medication, clearly labelled and listed in MyScout.
- Parents must complete a Y10 Medication Form (one per medication type), available via Q-Store or from your Group Leader.
- If your child uses an asthma puffer occasionally, please send it along.

First Aid & Wellbeing

- A First Aid Station will be located at the bunkhouse.
- Each activity zone will also have a first aid and sensory station for immediate support.

Camping Arrangements

 Venturers and Activity Leaders not camping with Units will be accommodated at Lones, unless other arrangements have been made.

Event Catering

- For those catered by the event, breakfasts and dinners will be served at Rymill.
- Logistics for lunches and teas are being finalised.
- Dietary requirements will be pulled from **MyScout** please ensure your records are up to date.
